Understanding How Duanesburg Ambulance Corps Operates: Insurance Billing Explained

At Duanesburg Ambulance, our primary goal is to provide timely and efficient emergency medical services to our community. To ensure that we can continue offering these vital services, we operate by charging the insurance of our patients. Here's a detailed explanation of how this process works and why it's essential for our operations.

Why We Charge Insurance

Ambulance services are critical in emergencies, providing life-saving care and rapid transport to medical facilities. However, these services come with significant costs, including medical equipment, trained personnel, and vehicle maintenance. By billing patients' insurance, we can cover these expenses and maintain the high standard of care our community expects.

Duanesburg Ambulance operation budget for 2025 is expected to be \$825,391.00. This number is for keeping the building operational, training our staff, medical supplies, vehicle maintenance and keeping our equipment up to today's standards. This number also includes staffing the building with 24-hour, 7 days a week with EMT's and EVO's. The costs for just staffing the building in 2025 is estimated to be \$638,197.00. This number includes salaries, payroll tax, workers comp, disability tax, and payroll insurances. Duanesburg Ambulance has asked the town to provide us through taxes of \$547,397.00.

The difference of \$277,994.00 is made up through medical insurance

billings, fish fries, donation campaigns, and other fundraising activities. Without charging the insurances of the patients we deliver lifesaving medical responses to, Duanesburg Ambulance could not continue to provide the services needed for our residents. In 2024, we had responded to over 600 calls. Unfortunately, 2024 was a year that has surpassed all years in the past.

How Insurance Billing Works

1. **Initial Assessment:** When we arrive at a scene, we collect necessary information, including your insurance details. This allows us to process the billing efficiently.

2. Insurance Claim Submission: After providing the necessary medical care and transport, we submit a claim to your insurance company. This claim includes details of the services provided, which are categorized based on the level of care required (e.g., basic life support, advanced life support).

3. Insurance Coverage:
Most insurance plans cover medically necessary ambulance services, but the extent of coverage can vary.
Typically, insurance will cover a

significant portion of the cost, but there may be out-of-pocket expenses such as copayments, deductibles, or coinsurance.

4. Patient Responsibility: If there are any remaining balances after the insurance payment, patients may receive a bill for the difference. We understand that medical expenses can be challenging, and we offer flexible payment options to assist our patients. If you have any questions, you can call our office and speak to our financial coordinator. This is a volunteer position as is with many other supporting personnel to keep the agency going. So please keep this in mind when you call.

Benefits of Insurance Billing

- Sustainability: Charging insurance helps us sustain our operations and continue providing high-quality emergency services. Through insurance billing we are estimating to offset the taxable request from the town over \$200,000.00
- Accessibility: By billing insurance, we can keep our services accessible to everyone in the community, ensuring that no one is denied care due to financial constraints.
- Efficiency: The insurance billing process allows us to streamline our operations and focus on what we do best—saving lives.

Your Role as a patient or a care provider

To help us serve you better, please ensure that your insurance information is up-to-date and readily available. In case of any changes in your insurance coverage, notify us promptly to avoid any billing issues.



The primary mission of the Lions Clubs is to assist those with vision and hearing impairment. We were pleased to donate \$1000 as a Diamond Sponsor for the DVAC Wellness Center fundraiser. This center will be a great asset to our community.

Our club is currently in the planning stages of a vision screening program for young children. Duanesburg Schools uses a Welch Allen Spot vision screener the club purchased to screen incoming Pre-K and Kindergarten children and throughout elementary and high school. We want to expand this screening to pre-school children to give us the opportunity to screen and refer children for diagnosis for eye disorders, like amblyopia, that may not otherwise be caught in such young children. The new DVAC Wellness Center will offer us the opportunity to conduct these screenings in an ideal screening environment.

The Duane Lions is involved in many community projects as well as disaster and relief efforts. We volunteer and contribute to local food pantries, Freedom Guide Dogs, and Camp Abilities Saratoga. These efforts are supported by our annual fundraisers including White Cane Days, raffles, and, our major event, Duanesburg Rocks Blindness Chicken BBQ, held in June. GoodRx

Did you have an occasion when your physician prescribed a medication

and you did not have the money at the time for the copayment and waited to have your prescription

filled? ...or you did not have prescription coverage and upon finding out the cost, you did not have it filled? You may have seen the commercial on TV? —





Take a few minutes to research what your prescription may cost using GoodRx, prior to purchasing your prescriptions? Even if you have a prescription plan with your current insurance, the copay maybe higher than what is would cost you

for the entire medication using GoodRx.

I would like share my experience during my 40 years of working in physician's practices; I have witnessed the benefits at no **cost** except for a **few minutes** of your time. As the Finance Chairman for Duanesburg Ambulance, I want to assure you that I am not advertising for nor do I have anything to do with GoodRx.

2024 ~ What Have We Done ~

The Emergency Medical Services industry is in crisis in many areas of New York and across the country ~ but not in Duanesburg, New York! The collaboration between the Town of Duanesburg and the Corps has secured a rapid, local response for the residents, visitors and travelers through the Town at times of crisis and need. This collaboration has improved response times (time of dispatch to time of arrival at an incident), brought local EMS leaders to scenes to best manage for optimal outcomes and scene management, enhanced the system itself to best serve the patient with strong collaborative partners and contributed to the mutual aid requests from Schenectady, Montgomery and Schoharie counties when available.

With all that in mind, let's explain a little bit of the mutual aid component:

- Schenectady County ~ the medical team has answered dispatches to the City of Schenectady, Town of Rotterdam, Town of Glenville, Village of Scotia, Town of Niskayuna and the Town of Princetown in 2024.These dispatches (primarily to the City of Schenectady and the Town of Rotterdam) have routinely resulted in our ambulance being cancelled prior to arrival at the scene; however, on those dispatches where a call was completed, medical leadership from the Corps was very attentive to coverage within the Town of Duanesburg and not a single dispatch for the Town of Duanesburg was missed and not a single patient waited for a crew already responding to another community.
- Montgomery County ~ medical leadership is in regular communication with the EMS leadership in Montgomery County to keep any of our responses to Montgomery County to the

- eastern end of the County (City of Amsterdam, Town of Amsterdam, Town of Florida, Town of Charleston, Town of Glen, Town of Mohawk) so our turnaround times and time from dispatch to arrival on the scene are more efficient. As with Schenectady County, many of these dispatches are also cancelled before we leave the Town of Duanesburg.
- Schoharie County ~ we have primarily responded into the Town of Esperance occasionally when Esperance Ambulance is not available, the number of times we have been dispatched to Schoharie County is quite small and has not resulted in a single declined dispatch as we are pleased to have collaborated with our mutual aid partner in Esperance Ambulance consistently.

The 2025 second quarter newsletter will contain the full data for the calendar year of 2024, and we look forward to highlighting our successes and determination to continue to serve the Town of Duanesburg as our primary focus and intent.

On an overall perspective, the Town of Duanesburg has been well-served by the agreement with the Duanesburg Ambulance in providing a quick response to dispatches. The Corps has also continued a strong bidirectional partnership with Duanesburg Central Schools for meetings, trainings, and event engagements. The entire town emergency response has benefited from the collaborative deployment of comparable automated external defibrillators (AEDs) so that this crucial equipment supports a smooth transition at multiple layers of response to sudden cardiac ar-

In 2023, the Corps was dispatched 475 times (including 8 standby services for special events) to 391 emergency responses in the Town of Duanesburg, 62 dispatches to mutual aid and 14 missed dispatches. In 2024 (to date), the Corps has been

dispatched 589 times (including 7 standby services for special events) to 384 emergency responses in the Town of Duanesburg, 198 dispatches to mutual aid (with a high percentage of cancelled mutual aid requests) and 1 missed dispatch in the Town of Duanesburg (Duanesburg Ambulance was on another in-town dispatch). The

Corps will provide a full statistical breakdown of 2024 in the next newsletter staying with our commitment to transparency and data-driven decision making.



• In 2009, we published our first of four volumes of *Remembering the Town of Duanesburg* containing a collection

of researched history and anecdotal stories by residents to acknowledge the history of child-hoods, families, people, businesses, events and changing lifestyles throughout the history of our community. We are now working on Volume 5 due out in 2026. Copies are available at our monthly meetings, online, and at the Town Hall.

• In 2018, after a very successful grassroots fund raising campaign, we

opened our Research and Archive Center at 450 Quaker Lane in the hamlet of Quaker Street. The Greek Revival Farmhouse mirrors the architectural style found within our town and was built by local builders Marty Hebert and his son Michael.

• Our Center preserves collections of photos, anecdotal history, genealo-



gies, clothing and textiles, and memorabilia pertinent to our town's history. Our essential team of volunteers catalog, organize and safely preserve our collection in appropriate archival boxes. We are open by appointment for research and for touring the lower level of the building containing meaningfully curated displays.

• This last June was our

first time having Duanesburg Elementary 4th grade students welcomed to our building for a student tailored event on local history.

Each September, we hold a community themed event. On Saturday, September 16, 2025, we will be celebrating the presence of the D and H Railroad within our town and the 1892 naming of Delanson will be commemorated. Check out our


